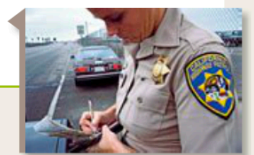
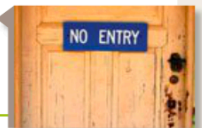

Key Words	Examples
• <b>consistently</b> (kun-sis-tent-lē) <i>adverb</i> ► page 565	The principal enforces school rules <b>consistently</b> so that all students are treated exactly the same way. <i>Synonym</i> : equally; <i>Antonym</i> : irregularly
<b>excessive</b> (ik-se-siv) <i>adjective</i> ► page 568	If something is <b>excessive</b> , it is more than the usual amount. It goes over usual limits. Tia's <b>excessive</b> spending caused her to run out of money quickly.
<b>intrusion</b> (in-trū-zhun) <i>noun</i> ► page 566	An <b>intrusion</b> occurs when people put themselves in situations or places where they have not been invited and are unwanted. It would be considered an <b>intrusion</b> if you walked through a doorway marked "No Entry."
<b>precaution</b> (pri-kaw-shun) <i>noun</i> ► pages 567, 577	A <b>precaution</b> is an action that a person takes to prevent possible danger or harm. Carlos sets his clock ten minutes early as a <b>precaution</b> against being late.
<b>proficiency</b> (pru-fi-shun-sē) <i>noun</i> ► pages 567, 577	Her <b>proficiency</b> in reading, writing, and speaking English is impressive; she almost never makes a mistake. <i>Synonym</i> : skillfulness; <i>Antonym</i> : inability
• <b>restrict</b> (ri-strikt) <i>verb</i> ► page 569	If you <b>restrict</b> something, you limit it. There are laws in many states that <b>restrict</b> 16-year-olds to working no more than three hours a day on school days.
• <b>transform</b> (trans-form) <i>verb</i> ► page 567	To <b>transform</b> is to change into something else. A caterpillar <b>transforms</b> into a butterfly when it emerges from a cocoon.
• <b>violate</b> (vī-u-lāt) <i>verb</i> ► pages 566, 576	If you drive faster than the speed limit, you <b>violate</b> the law and may get a ticket or fine. <i>Synonym</i> : break; <i>Antonym</i> : follow
